We ask that in the coming days and weeks, all our parishes offer fervent prayers for peace in Ukraine and in the world during services. We also encourage you to pray personally for peace, security and prosperity for all people, and for God's wisdom for those who decide the fate of nations.

We express our solidarity with the people and Christian churches of Ukraine.
